The Bournville BookFest 2016 has been organised by Bournville-based social enterprise Busy Parents Network and is kindly funded by Arts Council England, the Big Lottery, Library of Birmingham Trust and Bournville Village Trust.

Following on from the success of the last 2 Book Festivals we've extended the programme significantly this year. We're proud to be the first Children's Book Festival in the U.K. to put on a specially tailored programme for children with **Special Educational Needs** and we will be hosting this programme at the Selly Oak Trust School. For the first time, we're also extending our programme to cater for **teenagers and young adults up to the age of 18**.

Bournville BookFest is Birmingham's sole Children's Book Festival. As such, we've taken the step of extending the programme across the city this year so that more children can get involved. We're very grateful to all our new venues for making this possible. The Barber Institute, Bournville College, Library of Birmingham, Shard End Library and Yardley Wood library are all joining in this year's Bournville BookFest as host venues.

Children and young adults have endless capacity for creativity and Bournville BookFest is all about inspiring the next generation with a love of storytelling in all its many forms. New for this year, we're delighted to include storytelling through dance workshops. As you read the Programme you'll see we've gathered together a vast array of authors, illustrators, storytellers, poets and actors to entertain, inspire and enchant your children.

We even have a Festival Poet in Residence for Bournville BookFest 2016. Amongst other things, Spoz will be rapping on a chocolate theme!

Continuing the chocolate theme, we're delighted to be launching a brand new children's book at Bournville BookFest 2016. "Two Brothers & a Chocolate Factory" is a picture book written by local author Juliet Clare Bell and illustrated by local illustrator Jess Mikhail. It tells the inspirational story of Richard and George Cadbury. A copy of the book will be given to every child in Key Stage 2 living in Bournville in the week before the BookFest. We'll also be having a special Book Launch as part of Bournville BookFest 2016. We hope you will enjoy taking part.

We are committed to making Bournville BookFest as accessible as possible.

Assistance Animals are welcome to attend. Please let us know if you are planning to bring an assistance animal with you.

All of the sessions at Selly Oak Trust School are intended to be Relaxed Performances. We have a relaxed attitude to noise and movement and there are designated sensory areas in each room if a child needs them.

Nearly all festival venues are wheelchair accessible and have wheelchair accessible toilets. If you are wheelchair dependent and attending sessions at the Barber Institute, please let us know in advance so we can arrange for access.

The Nick Sharratt and Jeremy Strong performances will have sign language interpretation.

If you have any other access requirements, please do not hesitate to get in touch so that we can do our best to accommodate you.

Visiting The Festival with Children Under 12

Children under 12 years old must be accompanied to the BookFest by a responsible person aged 16 or over who is approved by the parent/guardian. For workshops at Bournville Junior School, parents are welcome to relax in our Poetry & Storytelling Café whilst children are at workshops but they are asked to remain on site.

Bournville BookFest has a Child Protection Policy but we cannot act in loco parentis or take responsibility for unsupervised children.

Teenagers and Young Adults attending our programme at Kings Norton Girls School can be dropped off by parents or attend on their own. We will ask parents to provide a mobile phone number as an emergency contact if needed. Finally, if anyone is disruptive they may be asked to leave an event.

Yardley Wood Library

Highfield Road, Birmingham, B14 4DU. It has a small car park and unrestricted parking on nearby roads. Wheelchair access and hearing aid loop.

Rowheath Pavilion

Birmingham Children's Book Festival Marquee Heath Road, B30 1HH. Rowheath Pavilion has an excellent café, and picnic tables outside for those who want to bring packed lunches. Has its own car-park.

The Barber Institute of Fine Arts

Concert Hall University of Birmingham, Edgbaston, B15 2TS. Parking is available at all times at the University's North-East Carpark off Pritchatts Road and some free parking is also available in the car parks and bays around the Barber Institute, accessible via the University's East Gate (off Edgbaston Park Road). The Number 61 & 63 bus routes go past the bottom of Edgbaston Park Road. 10-minutes' walk from University train station.



Two Brothers and a Chocolate Factory

Bournville BookFest 2016 is absolutely thrilled to announce the launch of a new children's book about the creation of Bournville: Two Brothers and a Chocolate Factory.



Written by local author Juliet Clare Bell, and beautifully-illustrated by former Bournville Infant School pupil Jess Mikhail, Two Brothers tells the remarkable tale of Richard and George Cadbury and their vision for Bournville: swimming pools, parks, fresh air, fairer pay, healthcare and education for factory workers. And they still managed to make delicious chocolate and turn a profit!

Packed with first-hand accounts from the last century, the book brings home the hard work and altruism it took to create this new kind of business – one which made a profit and cherished its workers


During the week of the book-launch, former workers and historians will be visiting schools to pass Bournville's story to a new generation of children.
